The Fire Marshall asked us to remind everyone in our neighborhood that fireworks are extremely dangerous and are illegal in Colorado Springs and surrounding communities. Any damage resulting from fireworks will be considered arson and will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. This would mean a possible charge as a class four felony, plus restitution, court costs, fines and possible jail time.
