THANK YOU: Mark Barker, District 17 State Representative, for addressing our membership during our November meeting, discussing bills currently being considered by the legislature and offering information on the re-districting of state precincts.

PROGRAM: Lt. Black, CSPD Sand Creek Division, will give a briefing on the task force that was formed to try to keep criminals out of our neighborhood. We are informed that calls for service in the neighborhood have gone down 40% since the task force was activated. At-large council members Brandy Williams and Val Snider also will be with us, to take questions and address our concerns. Carl Schueler, Senior Planner, Colorado Springs Land Use Review Division, also will update us on possible changes to the city's 'great streets' project (*Academy Blvd. Corridor Great Streets Plan.*) We hope to have a really good turnout for this meeting – let's demonstrate to all our guest speakers that we care about our neighborhood and our city. This is your chance to have your concerns addressed.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS: Once again, many homes in our neighborhood decorated with lights. Thanks to all who did such a good job participating in the festivities!
